
Jan. 8th., 1942


Well, at last I'me definite figures figures about my funlongh. I am to leave here the 29 th. (P: 17) of this mouth. As this is two days before pay day, you att can


I'm going to want 50 to knock around with. So please don't act surprised when I gak you for same. When I return the back from my fuslough, I'll be paid.

I'll send 50 home then.


I hope me mon't have any discrepancies about all this. I don't expect to spend all that money at home; but I want it just in case.

In fact, there's a Rold efidence down here. Every might me fut up publicles before retiring. I must have gotten a cold in my back; for this morning I fouldn't more it.




