

Lebanon 10<sup>th</sup> March 1780

Sir.

I have the honor to inclose you Copies of  
two Acts of the general Assembly of this State,  
passed at their late Session, for the repeal of the  
Sunder Act (so called) - and the establishment of the  
public Credit and Faith of the State. — This  
Measure, was dictated by a Desire to revert once  
more to the long forgotten paths of Justice and  
Integrity. — And the Legislature of the State  
flatter themselves with a hope, that they will  
ultimately prove honorable and beneficial, not  
to this only but (by their adoption of similar  
Measures) to our sister States, and the general  
Interests of America — And are  
happy to have the Example and Countenance of  
your State on this occasion —
